The Municipality of Middlesex Centre will soon be starting a road rehabilitation project in your area. This letter provides details about the project with important information on how construction may impact you.

Schedule: Tentative start date – August 10th, 2026
Estimated completion – September 4th, 2026

Scope: Milling or pulverizing of the road surface and repaving, adjustments to maintenance holes, utility valves, catch basins, and curb and gutter replacements at select locations.



Contractor: Armstrong Paving.

How will Construction Impact You?

Street Access and Parking: All roads will be open during construction only allowing local traffic to access their properties. Parking on the road during construction will be prohibited.

Vibration – Protect Valuables: Construction equipment can cause vibrations. Please ensure you protect any valuables susceptible to damage.

Mail Services: Canada Post will continue to deliver mail during construction. Canada Post will provide further notification and instructions for residents that may be impacted.

Garbage and Recycling Collection: If your pick-up point is temporarily blocked by construction, the Municipality will assist in collecting and transporting your garbage and recycling.

Sprinklers, Flower Beds, Invisible Fences, and Private Infrastructure: Residents are encouraged to remove any private infrastructure and items that may be inadvertently located in the municipal right of way. The contractor will not be responsible for or repair any private infrastructure damaged or removed as a result of this work.
